Subject: Request for Meeting with Tariff Reform Coalition

Dear Secretary Raimondo:

I am writing to you on behalf of the Tariff Reform Coalition (TRC), a broad-based alliance of 37 trade associations representing the many U.S. manufacturers, exporters, retailers, agricultural and food producers and other supply chain stakeholders adversely affected by the Section 232 and Section 301 tariffs imposed during the Trump Administration.

We believe many of these actions, which dramatically altered the cost structures of our member companies, failed to consider the broader effects on our businesses and workers, as well as the overall impact on our economy and trade relationships, while providing minimal benefit to the intended industries.

We would like to request a meeting with you and your team so that a representative group from our businesses can describe the impacts they have experienced and present our recommendations. We hope this information will be helpful to you as your Administration reviews these tariffs.

Our objective is to work with you to identify alternative strategies to address the legitimate concerns of steel and aluminum overcapacity and China's unfair trade practices. We also would like to suggest ways to improve the Section 232 exclusion process to ensure greater transparency and clear reasoning for denials.

We believe that unwinding the tariffs imposed by the Trump Administration, while at the same time implementing more workable alternatives to address legitimate policy concerns, will demonstrably improve the prospects for our industries to grow their businesses and expand their exports. This will in turn deliver far greater job gains than the current policies. Unwinding

the tariffs will also enable the U.S. to repair relations with some of our most important allies and trading partners.

I am attaching a statement recently issued by our coalition that describes our concerns with the current tariffs and our recommendations to address those concerns. It includes a list of our member associations.

We look forward to meeting with you to share more details and perspectives on the impact of these tariffs on the different industries and sectors represented in our coalition.
